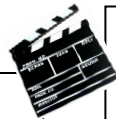

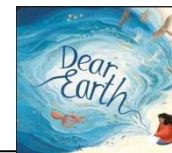


Create a comic strip or write a story from the item's point of view.

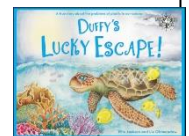
This could be written as a poem or told out loud as a story.
