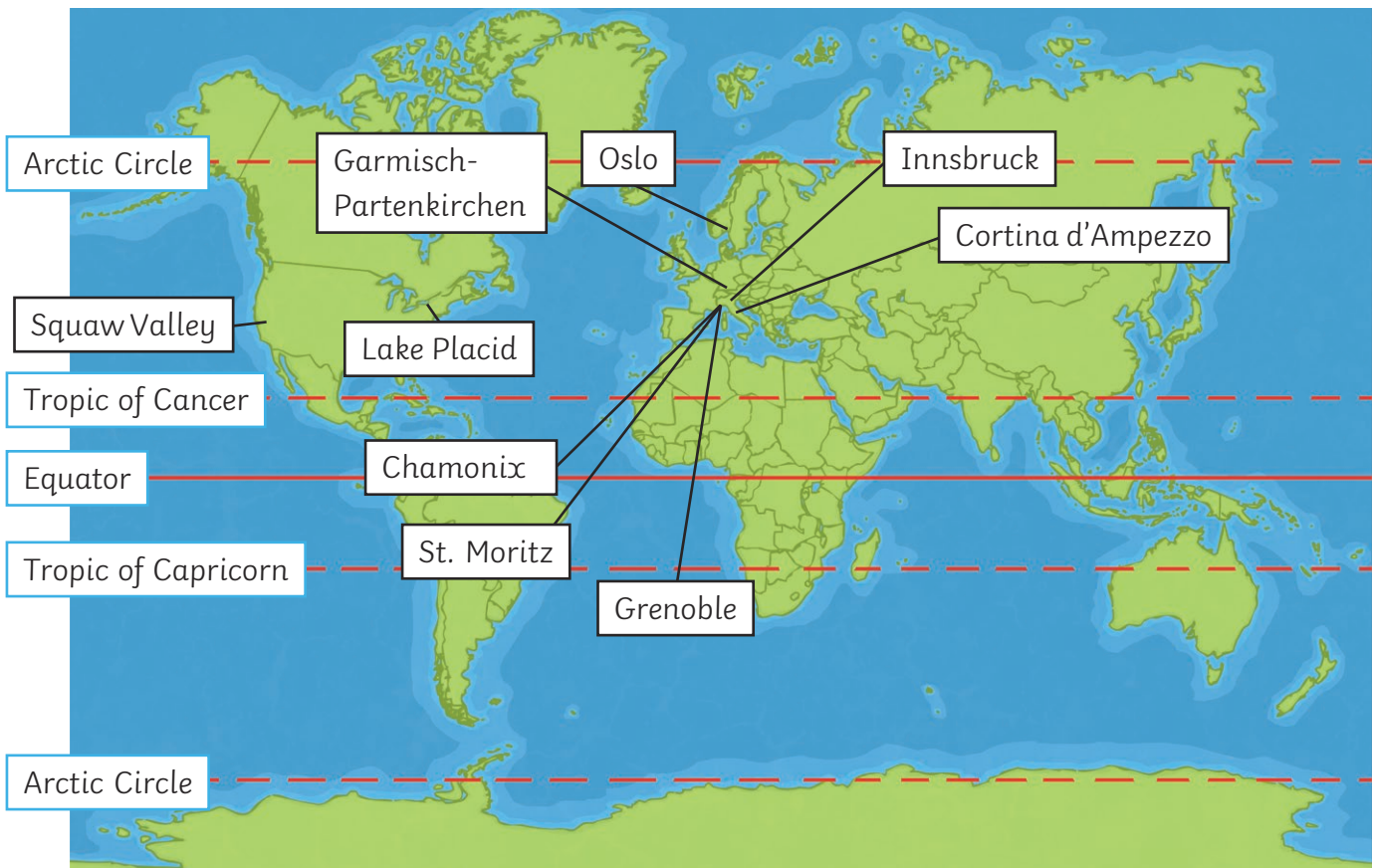

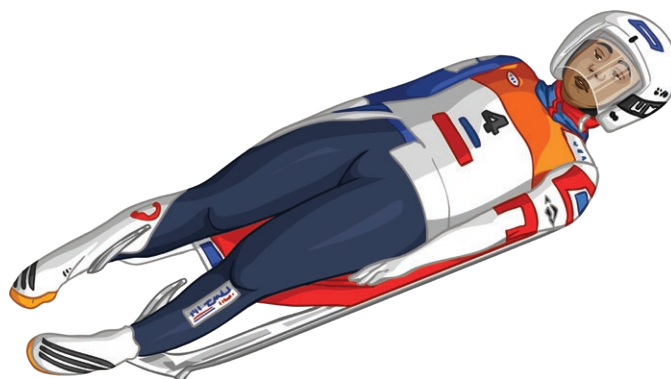


## Map to Show the Location of the Winter Olympics (1924 – 2022)

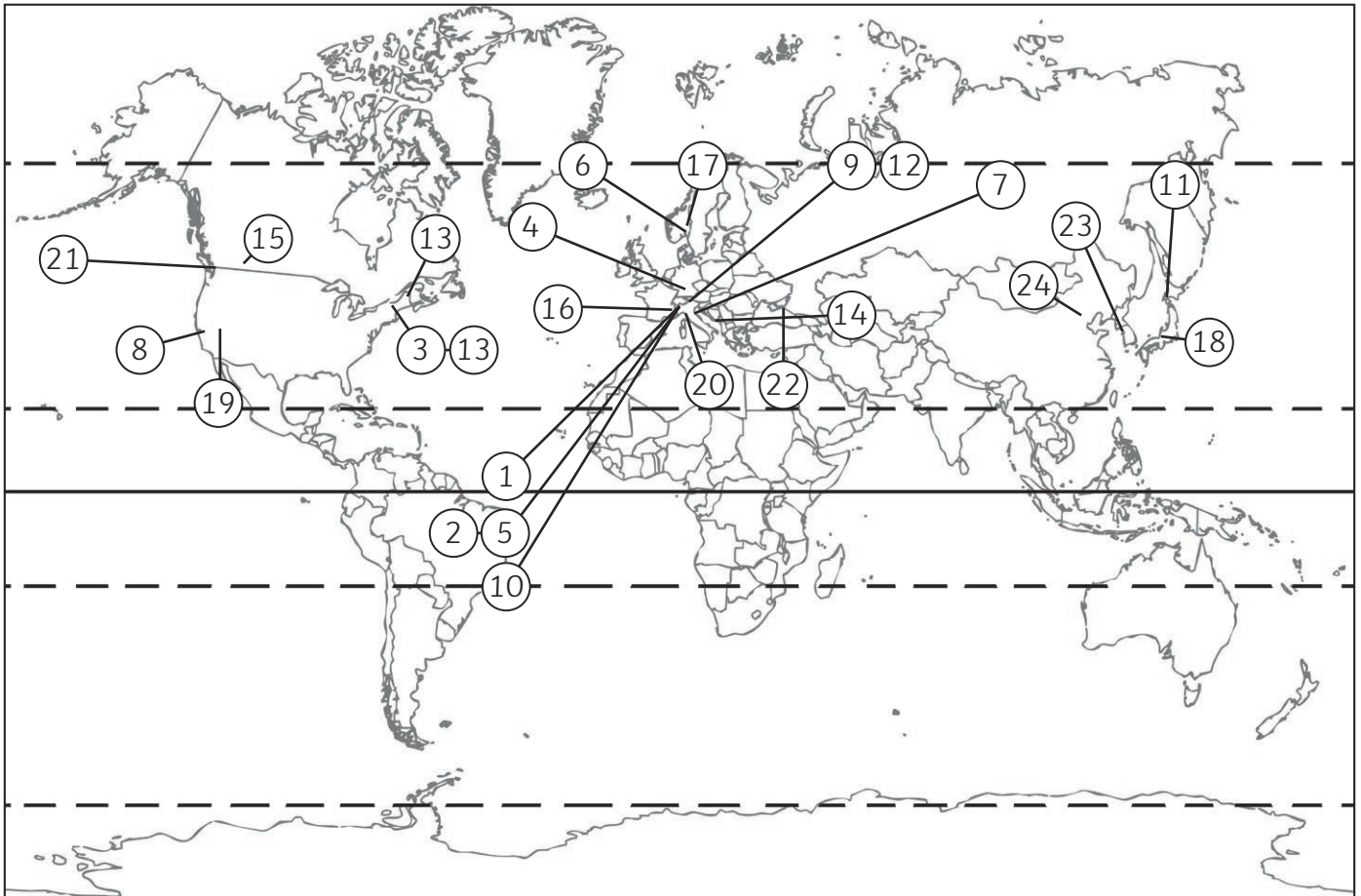


# Mapping the Winter Olympics Answers

1. The Winter Olympic Games are held every four years. In which years did the games not take place? Suggest a reason why.

**The 1940 and the 1944 Winter Olympics were both cancelled due to the outbreak of the Second World War. (The 1940 games were to be held in Sapporo, Japan, and the 1944 games to be held in Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy.)**

3. Which of the following statements describe the location of the Winter Olympic host cities? Tick the correct answers.

**The cities which have hosted the Winter Olympics are located:**

- in the northern hemisphere.

- in North America, Europe and Asia.
- in the southern hemisphere.

4. Can you suggest two reasons why the Winter Olympics are located in these parts of the world?  
**Reasons why the Winter Olympics have always been held in the northern hemisphere include:**
  - Cost - it is very expensive to build the required stadiums and infrastructure needed to host

the Olympics. The 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia cost US\$51 billion! It is only the world's wealthiest nations that can afford to host the games and most of these are located in the northern hemisphere.

- **Topography and Climate** - the Winter Olympics need reliable snowfall. There are many suitable locations in the northern hemisphere including the Alps and the Pyrenees in Europe and the Rocky Mountains in North America. In the southern hemisphere, there is less landmass at high altitudes, so the games would be limited to mountain ranges such as the Andes in South America or the Southern Alps in New Zealand. It would not be practical for the Winter Olympics to be held in Antarctica!
- **Seasons** - the southern hemisphere experiences their winter during the northern hemisphere's summer months.
